Maps

A map of the campus is available at <http://www.leeds.ac.uk/campusmap> in both printable and interactive formats, a printed version will be included in the delegate pack. An adapted version of this map, highlighting our venues and relevant landmarks, is included at the end of this booklet. These venues are all within a few minutes walk of each other, although routes avoiding stairs may take longer (e.g. approx. 5 minutes from Music to Storm Jameson with stairs, approx. 8 minutes with stairs).

In addition, the locations we are using and relevant landmarks are also included at the end of this booklet on a diagram where it is easier to see routes between them, a printed copy will be included in the delegate pack).

Information on how to get to the University is outlined below, see Travel to Leeds.

A good map of Leeds city centre is available from our website, see [Location](#) in the left menu on the [main conference page](#).

Conference Registration

The conference is being held in the School of Music, University of Leeds.

Registration is from 12:00 to 13:30 on Friday and 08:30-9:00 on Saturday and Sunday in the entrance-way of the School of Music, University of Leeds. The Registration desk will be manned throughout the conference. You do not need to register at the conference before checking in to your accommodation, but as you cannot check into your room until after 15:00 on the day of arrival, you may wish to register for the conference and leave your luggage in a secure room in the School of Music until the end of the afternoon session on Friday or Saturday, before going to Storm Jameson.

Accommodation

Accommodation is in Storm Jameson Court (part of Charles Morris Hall) - this is just a short walk away from all the conference venues. There is a 24-hour reception in the East Block where you may check in from 15:00 on the day of arrival. Delegates arriving on Friday before 15:00 can leave their luggage at Storm Jameson until the room becomes available, if checking in before registering for the conference, or in left in a secure room in the School of Music.

Each ensuite room will be provided with bed linen, a bath & a hand towel, complimentary wash pack, and access to tea/coffee-making facilities. Rooms have wireless computer access (see below). A safe is available in the room for valuables and laundry facilities are available in the shared kitchen/social areas, which also have comfy chairs and a TV.

Please check out of your room and return your key to the 24-hour reception by 10:00 on your day of departure. A charge of £20 is payable for any keys/fobs not returned. Luggage may be left at Storm Jameson after check out on Saturday or in left in a secure room in the School of Music.

Please ask taxis to Storm Jameson to drop you off on Mount Preston Street. If arriving by car, for your SatNav please use Mount Preston Street, Leeds, LS2 9JP for Storm Jameson Court. Car parking is very limited on campus, please see Travelling by Car in Leeds below.

Storm Jameson Court is approximately eight minutes walk (route without stairs) from the School of Music.

Delegates arriving on Thursday can check in to their accommodation from 15:00, while it may be possible to leave luggage at Storm Jameson earlier, you may wish to consider the left-luggage at Leeds City Railway Station if you are arriving early and want to look around town, see Left Luggage below.

Left Luggage

Please see Conference Registration (above) and Accommodation (above) for details of left-luggage arrangements on various days at Storm Jameson Hall or in a secure room in the School of Music. Left Luggage is also available at Leeds City Railway Station, £6 for 2 hours, £8 for 7 hours, located near the Wellington Street entrance and can be [pre-booked](#), or used on the day.

Meals

Breakfast

Breakfast will be available for residential delegates in the University Refectory, North dining room from 08:00 to 09:00. There are also tea and coffee making facilities in the shared kitchen facilities and/or in the bedrooms in your accommodation. Delegates who are staying in Storm Jameson on Thursday and/or Sunday nights will be provided with an individual continental breakfast in the shared kitchen area.

Refreshment Breaks and Lunches

Lunch on Friday and Saturday is included in the conference fee and will be a buffet selection with dishes suitable for vegetarians. If you have special dietary requirements these have been made known to the caterers; you will need to identify yourself to them if you are vegan or have a special diet.

Lunch is not provided on Sunday but there is a wide range of catering available on or near campus.

The Student Union building on campus has a small **supermarket** (which keeps fresh food and vegetarian, vegan and 'free from' lines; open Monday-Friday 08:30-17:30) and two **bars** (The Terrace and the Old Bar; open for food Monday-Friday 11:00-18:00; closing time 23:00), as well as a range of **takeaway food outlets** (Asian, Indian, British and vegan, mostly closed by 4pm on weekdays and not open at the weekend).

A number of excellent **cafes** and **sandwich shops** as well as other **takeaways** can be found opposite Parkinson Building along Woodhouse Lane. Turning left along Woodhouse Lane takes you towards more **takeaways**, three **pubs** (The Eldon, The Packhorse and the Library) which all serve food, two **cafes** and a couple of **Indian restaurants**. Turning right along Woodhouse Lane takes you towards Leeds city centre and a couple of **restaurants** and a **pub** (The Fenton) which serves food.

Evening Meals

For delegates who have booked the conference dinner, this will be silver service and held in the Woodhouse Suite of University House. Please enter through the Little Woodhouse Room, which will be laid out for easy mingling. Dinner will be served in the Great Woodhouse Room at 19:00. Tables will seat 8 and you will need to sign up for a table before 17:15 on Friday in order to have your choice of place. Place cards will indicate any dietary requirements for the servers. The non-vegetarian starter will be Whitby crab, if this is a problem for you, please let the organisers know as possible.

Dinner on Saturday will also be in the Woodhouse Suite of University House but will be a buffet including hot dishes (a meat, a vegetarian and a fish dish), salads and a choice of deserts.

All special dietary requirements have been made known to the caterers. Vegetarians and vegans (marked out with colour coding on name badges/place cards) will have a separate menu served to them. All dishes are gluten-free and all meat organic and halal.

Delegates who are organising their own dinner have a wide range of choices within easy walking distance or a brief bus ride. The [Faversham](#), a pub on campus (Springfield Mount) serves food from 12:00-20:00 on Thursday and Fridays, but is closed at the weekend. The [Terrace Bar](#) in the Students Union is open and serving food 10:00 till late. Headingley (take almost any bus headed up the road from Parkinson Building; approx. 10 minutes and £1-£2.70 single; £4.20 all-day ticket) is well equipped with Italian, Greek, Mexican, Thai and other restaurants to suit a range of pockets within each cuisine type. Akmal's in Hyde Park (the former public toilets in the park) is an excellent curry house and only 5-10 mins walk from Parkinson Building (past The Library Pub and left into the park) or Storm Jameson (head up Cloberry Street, turn right onto Lyddon Terrace and then go into the park opposite to the right and then towards the right, as if trying to get to the parallel road – Woodhouse Lane), Akmal's is open every day from 17:30 till the small hours of the morning, except Sunday when it closes at 23:00. The City Centre has a great number of restaurants to suit all pockets, but the greatest concentrations are around Millennium Square or on Park Row and the streets off Park Row to the right going away from The Headrow and towards the Railway Station. Banks and Shops

There are cash points located within the Student Union building on campus and outside the Marjorie and Arnold Ziff Building. There are also several major banks opposite the University main entrance (Parkinson Building) – opening times vary but these are usually only open Monday to Friday.

The nearest Post Office is in the St John's Centre in the City Centre. City Centre shops generally open between 9.00am and 5.30pm Monday to Saturday and 11.00am to 5.00pm on Sundays. Some shops remain open until 7.00pm on Thursdays.

The nearest pharmacy is Cohen Chemist, situated on Woodhouse Lane across from the Parkinson Building. Boots late night pharmacy (open until midnight) is located in Leeds City Railway Station.

The Student Union building houses a number of shops, bars and coffee bars, a hairdressers and Essentials, which is a mini-supermarket selling newspapers, magazines, stationery, drinks, sandwiches, snack and confectionery items (opening times vary but core hours are generally 08:30-17:30 Monday-Friday). There is a Tesco Metro (open 07:00-00:00 daily) and a newsagents opposite Parkinson Building.

Pubs and Bars

There are a number of nice pubs serving real ale located on/close to campus. The Faversham, a smart pub on campus (Springfield Mount) is closed at the weekend. Inside the University Union Building (32 on the campus map) has a number of bars, ranging from the pub-like Old Bar (11:00-18:00 weekdays, 12:00-22:00 Saturday, closed Sunday), the Terrace bar (with outdoor Terrace, 10:00 till late daily). Heading up Woodhouse Lane past Parkinson Building are the Eldon and the Packhorse, the former is a Sports bar and the latter a traditional English pub which serves real ale. There are a wide range of pubs and bars in the city centre, with a venue to suit every taste, try the [Leeds City Guide website](#) for ideas.

Computing

If you are planning on using a PowerPoint (or other electronic presentation), then you will need to know that the University of Leeds has Windows PCs and is able to accommodate .pptx files. We are planning to use the computer in the room (hardwired, rather than wireless) and while we can project from your laptop (if you have a MAC you will need an adapter), it would be easier all round if you were able to save your presentation to a memory stick and then upload it to the PC in the room before your session starts.

Wireless access is available in Storm Jameson Court and in many locations across campus, including the Business School. If you have eduroam (<https://www.eduroam.org/>) you will be able to log-on with your own username/password. Otherwise you will need to sign for a temporary Leeds username/password when registering for your accommodation and agree to uphold the University's terms of usage. Once you have those log-on details you can scan for available wireless networks and connect to meet-in-leeds.

There are also 24-hour PC clusters accessible by keycode that can be used by holders of a Leeds username/password. You can sign for a temporary Leeds username/password, also a keycode, at registration for accommodation on the understanding that you will uphold the University's terms of usage and the cluster rules of conduct and not divulge the keycode. The most conveniently located 24-hour PC cluster is the Textiles Cluster, Rooms G33/G34 in Clothworkers Link Building. Clothworkers is opposite the Student Union building, but to reach the cluster you need to walk to the other side of Clothworkers, turn left up University Road and continue until you pass underneath the link building. Then turn right and go into the first door on the right. G33/G34 cluster is through the door in front of you. It has 43 PCs, 2 scanners and an A4, A3, B&W, Colour Printer Copier & Scanner.

Photocopying/Printing

We expect that you will need 40 handouts. Handouts will be printed for **overseas speakers** who have sent their handout by email to the Conference Administrator (HerculesProject@leeds.ac.uk) by **9:00 on Thursday 6th July 2017**.

A media services shop is open between 9.00am and 4.30pm, Monday to Friday, on the ground floor (Level 6) of the Roger Stevens building (89 on the campus map) where there are photocopying facilities and other audio visual services available.

Printing in 24-hour clusters is by [Printer credits](http://printcred.leeds.ac.uk:8080/pcred/index.html), which can be purchased online (minimum £3.50) using a credit or debit card (<http://printcred.leeds.ac.uk:8080/pcred/index.html>). It may take 30 minutes for your MyPrint balance to register the purchase. MyPrint credit balances over £3.50 can be refunded to the purchasing card.

Sports Facilities

The Edge is the University of Leeds' Sport, Fitness and Wellbeing Centre and has a swimming pool that opens from 06:30-22:00 on weekdays, 08:30-17:15 at weekends. For further information, please see <https://sport.leeds.ac.uk/the-edge/>.

Emergencies and First Aid

In the event of any serious problems or for emergencies, please contact University of Leeds Security on +44 (0)113 343 5494 (24-hours). The emergency number in the UK for fire, ambulance or police is 999.

If first aid is required on campus please contact a member of staff in the building or for emergencies call Security via an internal telephone on x32222 or externally on +44(0)113 343 2222 - available 24-hours.

Hospital - the nearest emergency department is at the Leeds General Infirmary, telephone +44 (0)113 2432799, which is situated adjacent to the University.

Pharmacies - Cohen Chemist is situated on Woodhouse Lane across from the Parkinson Building. Boots late night pharmacy (open until midnight) is located at Leeds City Train Station.

Smoking

On 1 July 2007 England brought in a ban on smoking in all public places. All meeting rooms, lecture theatres, foyers, public areas, bars, doorways, entrances and bedrooms within the University operate a no smoking policy.

Travel to Leeds

The campus is approximately half a mile from the City Centre on Woodhouse Lane, the A660. Further details about the University and travel can be found on the [University website](#).

By Air

Leeds Bradford Airport is approximately 7 miles away. [Arrow Taxis](#) (which accept online credit card bookings) are available outside the terminal building, costing around £18-20 to Storm Jameson or the School of Music and taking 20-30 minutes. *Arrow Private Hire: +44 (0) 113 258 5888*

Alternatively you can take the Leeds Airport Bus (The Flying Tiger, service [757](#), follow link for timetable) to Leeds City Railway Station (£6 return; £3.80 single), this takes approx. 30 minutes, with services every 20 minutes during the day (including Sunday) and every thirty minutes in the evenings. The bus drops off on Wellington Street. You will then need either to catch a 1 bus from outside the Railway Station, opposite the Scarborough Taps to Parkinson Building – ask for “University Steps” (£2.40 single; £4.20 all-day) or a taxi from the taxi rank outside the Railway Station and the journey to the School of Music/Storm Jameson takes 10-15 minutes and will cost £7-9, depending on the time of day.

Manchester Airport to Leeds takes about an hour and a half by direct train (you can check the times on the [National Rail Enquiries](#) website). Train tickets can be booked in advance online through [National Rail Enquiries](#) (registration required) or other online train ticket providers and collected from machines on the station with the same credit/debit card as was used for the booking. Once you get to Leeds City Railway Station there is a taxi rank outside and the journey to the School of Music/Storm Jameson takes 10-15 minutes and will cost £7-9, depending on the time of day. The number 1 bus from just outside the Railway station (opposite the Scarborough Taps pub) takes about 10 minutes to Parkinson Building – ask for “University Steps” (£2.40 single; £4.20 all-day) with services “every ten minutes or less” during the daytime on weekdays.

By Train

The closest station is Leeds. For train information and timetables visit the [National Rail Enquiries](#) website. There is a taxi rank outside the station. The journey to the School of Music/Storm Jameson takes 10-15 minutes and will cost £7-9, depending on the time of day. The number 1 bus from just outside the Railway station (opposite the Scarborough Taps pub) takes about 10 minutes to Parkinson Building – ask for “University Steps” (£2.40 single; £4.20 all-day) with services “every ten minutes or less” during the daytime on weekdays.

By Coach

The [National Express Coach Station](#) is adjacent to the [Central Bus Station](#), from which there are frequent buses, including numbers 28, 96, and 97, all of which stop at Parkinson Building – takes about 12 minutes to Parkinson Building – ask for “University Steps” (£2.40 single; £4.20 all-day) with services “every ten minutes or less” during the daytime on weekdays, half-hourly at other times.

From Leeds City Centre, most buses towards Headingley will stop at Parkinson Building – ask for “University Steps”, including the 1, 6, 28, 56, 95 and 97. Visit the [West Yorkshire Metro](#) and [First Leeds](#) websites for timetables and general information. An all-day bus ticket costs £4.20, single fares will vary from £1 (student) to £2.70.

By Car

Leeds is linked to the M1 and M62. From the city centre follow signs towards Headingley and Universities. Limited parking is available at Storm Jameson Court for residential delegates. Limited parking is available on campus near the School of Music after 17:00 on Friday and at weekends, for further details of parking for non-residential delegates, please follow [this link](#). **For SatNav:** for the School of Music use Woodhouse Lane, LS2 9JT (which may appear as Cavendish Road in some navigation systems) and for Storm Jameson Court use Mount Preston Street, Leeds, LS2 9JP.

Travelling by Car in Leeds

Parking at the University of Leeds is open to the public from 17:00 to 07:00 on weekdays and all day throughout the weekend in the multistorey carpark (106 on the campus map) on a pay and display basis. Charges and costs vary but are £6 for 6 hours and £12 for 24 hours at the weekend.

The closest public car park is Woodhouse Moor Multi-Storey, which is run by Leeds City Council and costs £6.00 for 4 hours, £7.00 for 12 hours, with a weekend ticket lasting Friday 00:01 to Monday 09:00 costing £12.20. Some of the public streets to the west of the University Campus do not have parking restrictions, but these are very busy from 07:00 to 17:00, Monday to Friday. Information on parking in Leeds is available by searching on www.parkopedia.co.uk.

SatNav navigates to the University more easily with street names rather than postcodes. The University's postcode of LS2 9JT covers the whole campus and is used by SatNav to refer to the Main Entrance, which is at the junction of Woodhouse Lane and Cavendish Road near Parkinson Building. Please use LS2 9JP for Storm Jameson Court on Mount Preston Street.

Travelling by Public Transport in Leeds

From the railway station you can take the number 1 bus to the main entrance of the University (ask for "Parkinson Steps". The number 1 bus leaves from outside the railway station (at road level opposite the Scarborough Taps pub) and costs £2.40 one way (£1 student fare). Once there, follow the directions under "Travelling on Foot in Leeds". Buses run to campus approximately every ten minutes during the day and every half hour in the evening.

The National Express Coach Station is adjacent to the Central Bus Station, from which there are frequent buses, including numbers 28, 96, 97. You should ask for "University Steps" and get off the bus at the main entrance adjacent to the Parkinson Building. Once there, follow the directions under "Travelling on Foot in Leeds". Buses run to campus approximately every ten minutes during the day and every half hour in the evening.

You can purchase a daily ticket on the buses for unlimited travel in Leeds for £4.20 (cheaper after 9.30am), a weekly travel ticket for unlimited use within the City Centre/University area costs £15.00 per week. A daily travel ticket for unlimited use for the whole of the West Yorkshire area is £4.80, £20.00 per week. A single trip ticket from the City Centre to the University is between £2.40 and £2.10, depending where you get on. Please buy any of these from the bus driver.

Travelling by Taxi in Leeds

'Black and White' taxis are the 'real' taxis that you can hail anywhere. Streamline-Telecabs - 0113 244 3322 or 0113 2630404.

Private hire cars must be pre booked: Headingley Cars - 0113 243 4445, Amber Cars - 0113 231 1366, Arrow - 0113 258 5888 (Arrow taxis are the official Leeds/Bradford Airport taxi company).

Taxis from Leeds/Bradford Airport cost approx. £20.00 one way (10 miles). It can be cheaper to book a return journey and Central Cars allows you to pay for this (or any other journey) online by credit card (<http://www.taxi-leeds.com/About.htm>).

Taxis from Leeds railway station to Storm Jameson or the Business School cost approx. £5-£7 depending upon the time of day.

Travelling on Foot in Leeds

The University campus is a 20 minute walk from Leeds railway station:

Come out of the station into City Square; with the Queens Hotel behind you, walk straight up Park Row. Continue up Park Row until the first major junction. Cross straight over The Headrow and continue up Cookridge Street. At the next set of lights go straight on, passing Millennium Square on your left and the Leeds City Museum on your right. Turn left on to Woodhouse Lane, a busy main road. You'll pass Leeds Metropolitan University on your left and the University campus begins in another 50 metres or so, on your left after you have crossed over the bridge. To reach Parkinson Building, carry on up Woodhouse Lane to the clocktower building.


Once you arrive at the main entrance to the university, just before Parkinson Building, turn left down Cavendish Road and continue past the Ziff Building and English to the School of Music (on the right) for conference registration. For Storm Jameson (route without steps), once you arrive at Parkinson Building turn off under the archway between it and the adjacent building and continue up University Road, turning left just before you get to the Great Hall, then right past the Student Union, Refectory and University House. Turn left down Cromer Terrace, at the bottom, Charles Morris Hall with Storm Jameson Court in it is immediately opposite to the left and the 24 hour Porter's lodge clearly sign-posted.


